Additional Action:

- Explanation of the changes in the way we operate in order to return to face-to-face meeting, obtaining parents' contentment and consent for their children to return to Scouting in face-to-face meetings and their confirmation that they understand and adopt the requirements of this Risk Assessment will be achieved by publication of it on the Group's website, its social media and bullet pointed in existing means of effective 2-way communication which already exists and is in operation between Leaders, parents & young people via the "CubzApp" WhatsApp group or whatever other means become necessary
- Updates on further changes will be achieved utilising the same means mentioned above which already exist and are in effective operation
- Due to the impracticalities and lack of facilities which outdoor face-to-face meetings present there will be no availability for "blending" face-to-face with Zoom or other online meeting facilities to include those who may be vulnerable or are shielding
- Attendance of young people, Leaders and volunteers for each face-to-face meeting will initially be recorded using the paper register. Attendance details will be transferred that same evening to the electronic Register section of OSM (Online Scout Manager) which must already include each attendee's details for the purpose of tracking & tracing BEFORE the meeting they attend

o Plan programmes satisfactorily with regard to distancing, etc.
o Games/activities that involve either close or possible touching or contact to be excluded.
o Section numbers to be kept sufficiently low to allow distancing up to the recommended maximum limit which is currently set at 15 young people and 5 adult Leaders (plus any individual carers) in each number of groups into which the Pack needs to be split operating a minimum distance apart of 25 metres apart across which Leaders movement is permitted but should be limited to only essential reasons
o In the event the Meeting is near to Church and its facilities are used – toilets, washrooms, touchpoints, etc, are to be cleaned & sanitised afterwards in accordance with Church's specifications
 Before, after & during, if appropriate, any equipment used to be cleaned & sanitised
 Leaders and anybody above Cub Scout age should wear face masks at least and other PPE deemed necessary where delivery of an activity does make it difficult for their use

o Updates on further changes will be achieved utilising the same means mentioned above which already exist and are in effective operation
 A printed QR Code to be displayed at the entrance to each meeting entrance for use by those aged 16 years and over using the NHS Test & Trace app.
o Attendance of young people, Leaders and volunteers for each face-to-face meeting will initially be recorded using the paper register. Attendance details will be transferred that same evening to the electronic Register section of OSM (Online Scout Manager) which must already include each attendee's details for the purpose of tracking & tracing BEFORE the meeting they attend
o Generally, Cub Pack nights will either be by face- to-face OR Zoom meeting. Notification of which will be clearly communicated to parents, Leaders and all others who require it by whatever communication channel is appropriate for each respective person. However, in order to include those who may be vulnerable or are shielding "Blended" Zoom meetings will be made available to any Leader or young person
 Facilities exist to enable the Cub Pack to be split into two groups of no more than 15 young people and 5 adults (plus any individual carers) and meet concurrently in two meeting places withing St John's Church separated entirely by a sealed glass screen

	 Segregation of the two meeting places is to be achieved in its entirely by way of the provision of separate facilities including but not limited to their own entrance/exit, Leaders to operate, facilities, toilets, first aid kit and other equipment; all these and every other item or person utilised in one meeting place WILL NOT transfer between meeting places before and during Cub Pack Meetings
	 Toileting, eating, drinking & thorough hand washing should be done before leaving home to attend Cub meeting
	 Cubs' own drinking bottle, if required, to be brought in and its used solely by its owner's
