### Subscriptions...

The subscriptions payable to the Group are to cover the costs associated with running a Scout Group and go towards:

- Membership payment to The Scout Association
- The rent for the use of the Church Hall and facilities
- Admin and establishment expenses (insurance, printing etc.)
- Badges
- and many other things...

Subs are £120 per child/per annum, split evenly between school terms. If a member joins part way through a term then a pro rata payment will be requested before moving to a regular payment schedule in the following full term.

All subscription payments are collected through **Online Scout Manager (OSM),** via our payment provider, GoCardless, with the following due dates:

Winter term - 1<sup>st</sup> October Spring term - 1<sup>st</sup> February Summer term - 1<sup>st</sup> May

### Gift Aid...

If you pay Income Tax, then the Group can claim Gift Aid, set against the tax that you will have paid on the amount of your child's subscription or any donations that you may make to the Group.

Donating through Gift Aid means we can claim an extra 25p for every £1 you give and it will not cost you anything extra!

#### The rules for 'Gift Aid' are simple:

- you must sign a 'Gift Aid Declaration Form'.
- your donations will qualify as long as they are not more than 4 times what you have paid in tax in that Tax Year (6 April to 5 April).
- you must inform the Group Treasurer if you stop paying enough tax

## On-line Scout Manager (OSM)...

Online Scout Manager is the primary platform for record keeping for 5<sup>th</sup> Carlton Scout Group. These records include attendance, badge records and contact information for our young people.

All parents will be invited by the Section Leader to access Parent Portal, where you will be able to login and see how your young person is progressing with their badge work, view upcoming events, and make online activity payments for certain sections.

#### **COMPULSORY**

#### **Youth Member Information Form**

This provides us with important details about your child. The information will be uploaded onto OSM (On-line Scout Manager), a safe and secure administration and Group management system.

If your details change at any time, please complete a replacement form and hand in to your Section Leader

#### **Health Form**

This provides us with important information about the health of your child, so that we can provide a safe environment. The details, which you give on this form, will be kept on file by the appropriate Section Leader for all future activities.

Please note: No young person will be allowed to undertake/participate in any activity unless a current Health Form has been completed.

If your details change at any time, please complete a replacement form and hand in to your Section Leader

#### **Gift Aid Form**

If you pay Income Tax, please complete the 'Gift Aid Form' included in this Pack and return to the Group Scout Leader, so we are able to claim an extra 25p on every £1 you pay in Subs/donate.

### **News by Email...**

Our website incorporates an emailing system which sends out the latest news direct to your personal e-mail address, ensuring you do not miss out on anything relating to our Scouting activities and fundraising events.

If provided on your 'Youth Member Information Form', your e-mail address will be automatically registered with our 'News by Email' system. You are, however, able to unsubscribe if you do not wish to receive e-mails from us.

As always, we would welcome any views and/or suggestions you may have regarding our website or this system.

### Church Parades...

A Church Parade Service is usually held once each term, on the second Sunday of the month (during school terms).

We encourage all our members to attend the Service, no matter what their religion. It is a way of supporting the Church, which is our sponsor. Those who have gained badges are presented with them during the Service and this gives an opportunity for our young people's hard work to be recognised.

Families are very welcome to come along. Refreshments are available after the Service and parents will have an opportunity to chat to Leaders about their child's progress.

### Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS)...

To ensure that all the young people are safe whilst in our care, we require that any adult who helps at meetings, outdoor activities (including camps) or assist with transport are cleared by a 'disclosure check' through the Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS).

To complete a 'disclosure check', you will need to fill in an 'Adult Application Form', which will be used by the Group Scout Leader to enter your details on to Compass (the Scout Association's membership system). This will enable a 'disclosure check' to be applied for. The request is then passed onto the Scout Association's online disclosure processing system (Atlantic Data) and the applicant will then need to meet up with the Group Scout Leader who will check various forms of ID to confirm their identity.

Please note: completing an 'Adult Application Form' does not commit you to volunteering but it does cover you if, at any time, you offer to help with transport or volunteer your services in other ways.

#### **Group DBS Policy**

It is part of the Safeguarding Policy of 5<sup>th</sup> Carlton Scout Group:

- To keep an up-to-date list of all adults who have been cleared through DBS.
- To **NOT** allow contact with the young people for those who fail a DBS check.
- To reserve the right to exclude contact with the young people for those who do not complete the DBS process.
